

What is Title I?

Title I is a federally-funded program that is part of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. The purpose of this legislation is to provide additional opportunities for struggling children to meet grade level expectations outlined in the Minnesota Academic Standards. Schools where at least 40% of students qualify for free and reduced price meals can become Title I Schoolwide schools. They are required to write annual goals that address the specific needs of the school. Through this model, Title I resources can be used to benefit all students in the school, but especially the educational needs of the lowest-achieving children. Teachers, families and students all play a role in a school meeting its Title I Schoolwide goals.

WHAT IS A TITLE I FAMILY-SCHOOL COMPACT?

SCHOOL GOALS

READING

The percentage of each student enrolled October 1 in grades 3-5 who are proficient on all reading state accountability tests* will increase from 42.9% in 2016-2017 to 52.9% in 2017-2018.

The percentage of each Black/African American student enrolled October 1 in grades 3-5 who are proficient on all reading state accountability tests* will increase from 42.9% in 2016-2017 to 52.9% in 2017-2018.

MATH

The percentage of each student enrolled October 1 in grades 3-5 who are proficient on all math state accountability tests* will increase from 42.9% in 2016-2017 to 52.9% in 2017-2018.

The percentage of each Black/African American student enrolled October 1 in grades 3-5 who are proficient on all math state accountability tests* will increase from 14.5% in 2016-2017 to 24.5% in 2017-2018.

SCIENCE

The percentage of fifth grade students enrolled October 1 who are proficient on all science state accountability tests* will increase from 31% in 2016-2017 to 41% in 2017-2018.

The percentage of Black/African American fifth grade students enrolled October 1 who are proficient on all science state accountability tests* will increase from 8% in 2016-2017 to 18% in 2017-2018.

OTHER SCHOOL GOALS

- To have 80% or more of our students meet the ROCK matrix with proficiency (PBIS Framework)
- To decrease referrals by 50% (from 497 to 248 or less)
- To decrease suspensions by 50% (from 124 to 62 or less)

- Tier I: class-wide instruction and support for all students
- Tiers II and III: instruction for struggling students using research-based intervention
- Use of Responsive Classroom and National Urban Alliance strategies to enhance student learning
- Culturally-Relevant Instruction to build classroom community and engage all learners

AT HOME

Lakeview Elementary parents/guardians joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

- Talking with and engaging students in discussions about school
- Ensure that students get adequate sleep so they are ready to learn
